# PLEASE NOTE – a word about entering into and/or completing worship on

Sundays: Many folks utilize the time before the 10:15 am service begins to prepare themselves for worship (in prayer, in silence). Our hope is that folks coming into the church in the lead-up to worship, as you take your seat and greet people, will be mindful that there are people praying and listening to the music prelude. Please keep conversations to a minimum and, if talking, do so quietly. When the final blessing is given, remember that Blake has prepared a stunning postlude on the organ that follows the service, and many people really like listening to it. So, please, if you are ready to head down to Coffee Hour or desire to have a wonderful conversation with a friend after worship, please do so *outside* the sanctuary, so that those who wish to pray or listen to the postlude can do so. We all have different ways of entering and/or leaving worship, but let's try to create an environment of prayer before and immediately following the service for those who desire it.

# Outreach Corner

Church by the Pend: this Saturday, February 22<sup>nd</sup>, St. James will provide lunch in Bushnell Park for homeless men, women, and children. This program provides a healthy meal on a day when no soup kitchens are open. The afternoon begins with a Eucharistic service in the beautiful outdoors, followed by distribution of bagged lunches. From Church by the Pond (an outreach of our Cathedral): "We are all God's children and greet each other as brothers and sisters in Christ." We put together 50 bagged lunches, which means 100 meat and cheese sandwiches. Donations are still needed for a few items and should be brought to the parish before this Saturday.

We also need 10–12 people in the church kitchen to make the sandwiches and pack the bags that Saturday morning at 11 am, and 8–10 people to serve the lunches in Bushnell Park at 2 pm. Older children are welcome to accompany parents for either or both – what a great way to minister together as a family! If you can't be present that day, you can drop off a contribution of food earlier in the week. A sign–up sheet is in the narthex or contact Sue in the parish office to indicate your donation choice.

**2025 Chili Cookoff!** On Tuesday, March 4<sup>th</sup>, we'll hold our *Chili Cookoff* to say farewell to the season before Lent. Beginning at 5:30 pm on Tuesday, we'll offer a variety of chilis for the enjoyment of our parishioners and guests.
